Moreover, Rural poverty is prevalent throughout the world, with a 17.2% rate more than three times the urban average.


Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions (SDG 16)

All types of violence have a profound effect on society. Children’s health, behavior, and capacity to succeed are all impacted by violence. Trauma is brought on, and social inclusion is weakened. Conflicts stay unsolved and individuals are unable to get security and accountability when there is an absence of access to justice. Institutions which do not operate in accordance with valid laws are more likely to act arbitrarily and misuse their authority, and they are less capable of providing universal access to public services. Discrimination and exclusion lead to anger and hatred, which can lead to violence in addition to violating human rights.

Genuinely being invested in what a government is conducting helps a society become more conscious of the reality of violence, the value of peaceful and equitable societies, and practical ways to accomplish the SDGs. Achieving the objective could be facilitated by utilizing the right to freedom of information, the right to hold elected officials accountable, and the right to express one’s opinions to elected authorities (SDG). The circumstances for a life of dignity for everyone can be improved by fostering inclusiveness and respect toward persons of diverse backgrounds, ethnic origins, faiths, gender, or different viewpoints.

Kevin Hines, who survived suicide by leaping off the Golden Gate Bridge, motivates and instructs people on how to maintain a healthy mental state in the hopes of reducing the number of suicides. What struck me upon hearing his story was when he said "god please save me I made a mistake". Which made me think of the amount of people that regret it in that instant moment.

Storyteller Kevin Hines shares adventures.

In addition to being a best-selling author and renowned public speaker, he also makes award-winning documentaries. Kevin made an attempt on his life in the year 2000 by leaping off the Golden Gate Bridge. His amazing survival was made possible by a sea lion, who kept him afloat until the Coast Guard came, among other things. Kevin is currently on the road teaching people of all ages the art of wellness and how to endure pain with true toughness



while sharing his narrative of optimism, healing, and faith. Only 36 people survived the fall from the Golden Gate Bridge, including him (which is less than 1% of the human population)

People all over the world have been motivated by Kevin's desire to live and maintain mental health. His inspiring tale has inspired a wide range of people all over the world, including those in colleges and uni-

versities, high schools, businesses, the military, the health and medical professions, law enforcement agencies, and numerous industries. Many people have told Hines that his narrative helped them live longer. His narrative has been heard by millions of people and influenced them.

Kevin emphasizes the strength of the human spirit to lead us in discovering meaning, gratitude, and purpose in life while spreading uplifting messages about

maintaining mental health and the necessity of seeking assistance and support through difficult times. He inspires audiences worldwide with his compassion, optimism, and message of healing while imparting simple yet effective techniques for developing long-term mental well-being for ourselves and everyone around us.
