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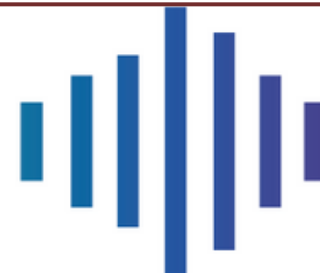

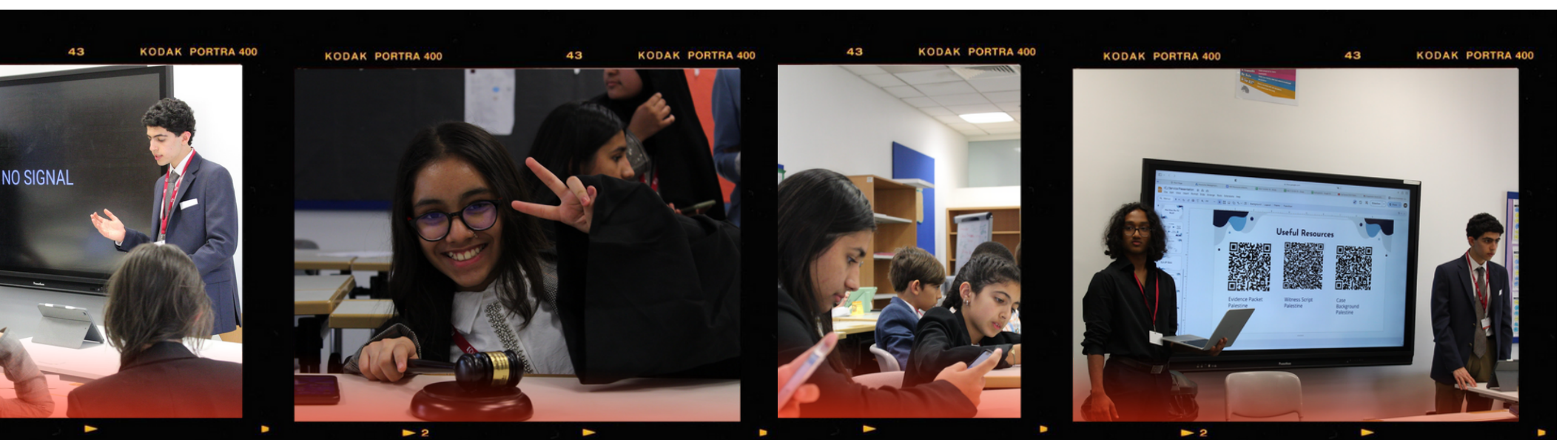
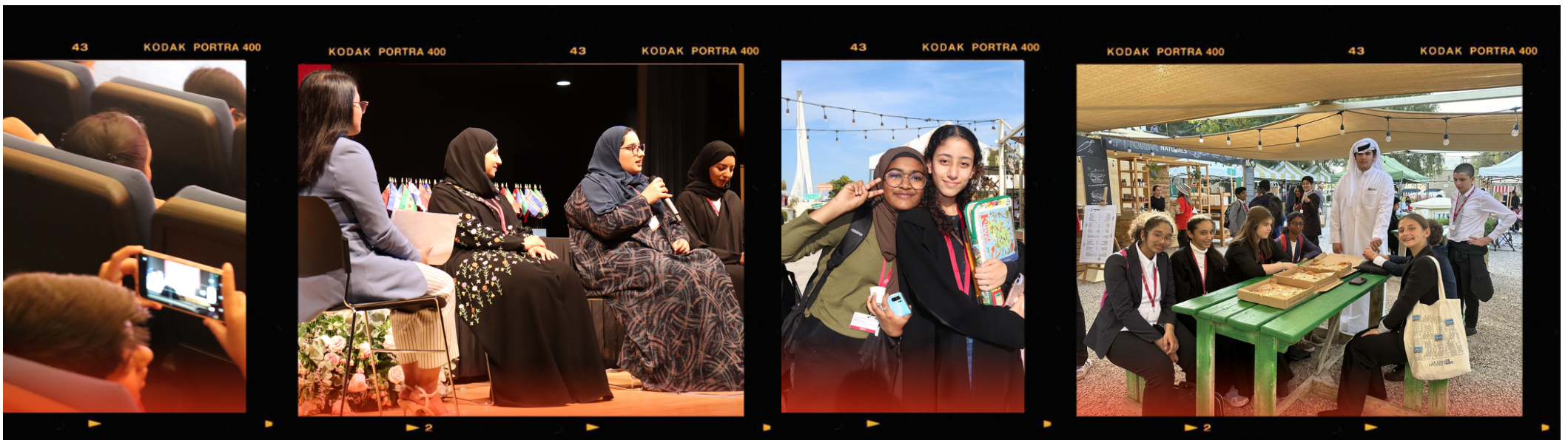
This commitment to mentorship exemplifies the delegate's understanding of the importance of nurturing the next generation of diplomatic leaders.

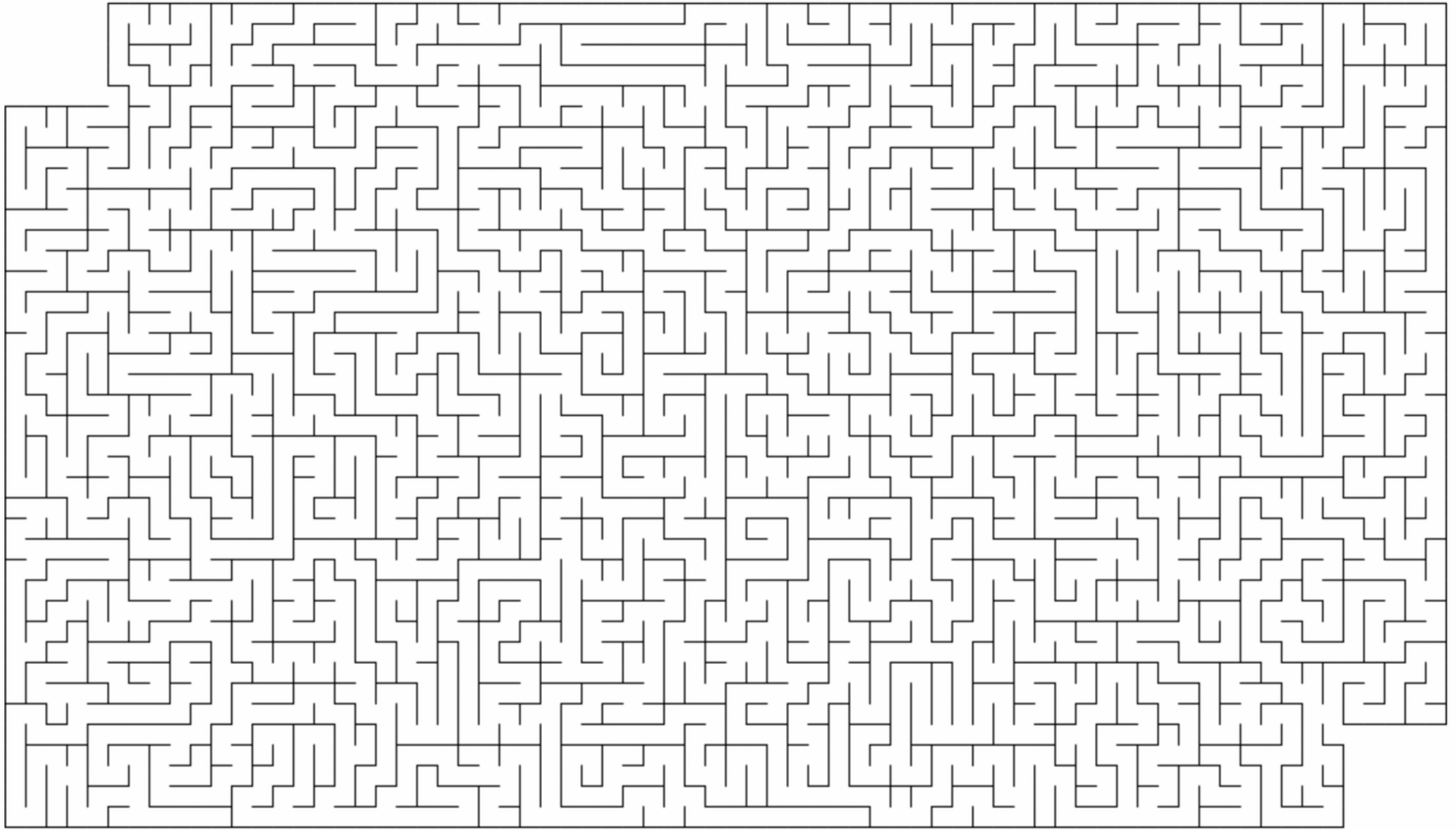
